Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible ?	\$2,000 person/ \$4,000 family. Doesn't apply to preventive care.	Generally you must pay all the costs from providers up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you elect individual coverage, you must meet the individual coverage deductible amount. If you have family coverage, family members must meet their own individual minimum annual deductible of \$4,000 as defined by the IRS guidelines until the family deductible has been met.
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Yes. Preventive care is covered before you meet your deductible .	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply.
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	For covered services with in-network providers : \$5,000 /person or \$10,000 /family.	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan , they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met .
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Premiums, balance-billed charges, and health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .
Will you pay less if you use a network provider ?	Yes. See www.fallonhealth.org/plandocs or call 1-800-868-5200 for a list of participating providers .	This plan uses a provider network . You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network . You will pay the most if you use an out-of-network provider , and you might receive a bill from a provider for the difference between the provider's charge and what your plan pays (balance billing). Be aware, your network provider might use an out-of-network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your provider before you get services.
Do you need a referral to see a specialist ?	Yes.	This plan will pay some or all of the costs to see a specialist for covered services but only if you have a referral before you see the specialist .

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes
